The 16th Cottage and Garden Tour: Shall We Gather at the River? Past, Present and Future

The tradition of gathering at the St. Lawrence River in Thousand Island Park each summer continues as it has for generations. This year, the Tour will celebrate the historic tenacity of the Park as well as the stalwart hope for the future. The Thousand Island Park Landmark Society welcomes you to join us on Thursday, July 16th for the 16th Cottage and Garden Tour.

The night prior to the Tour, we will hold an event to unveil a limited edition print of the Edith Lunt Small painting, "Thousand Island Park" that currently hangs in the Landmark Building. The Estabrook Trust has graciously allowed the Landmark Society to make a high quality reproduction of the work of art. Our honored guests will include the artist, Edy Lunt Small and the family of Betsy Estabrook. Please join us for a festive evening.

Morning and afternoon tours on Thursday will begin at the Tabernacle with a traditional camp meeting led by long-time TIP resident, Reverend Jim Brown. We will revisit a time when friends and neighbors gathered in the Tabernacle for a revival of community through fellowship and song. Reverend Brown will guide us with a talk on how TIP has risen from the ashes over the years. The Tabernacle choir will lead us in song to rejoice in the strength of the past, present and future of TIP.

The Tour will provide an architectural, historical and current perspective of landmarks, cottages and gardens throughout the Park. The Chapel, Corporate Office building and the Wellesley Hotel stand as reminders that all was not lost in the Fire of 2014. The Thousand Island Park Museum, located on the porch of the Wellesley Hotel, will be open to tour attendees. The museum collection is fascinating and extensive; take some time to explore each of the exhibits. Six significant cottages and gardens found between Prospect Point and St. Lawrence Avenue will offer a look at Early and Later Campground cottages from the Tent Platform to the Eastlake and then Shingle styles of architecture. Docents are available for inquiries about the cottages and gardens at each location. Lemonade and water stands will be open throughout the Tour. These stands are built, supplied and manned by our local children. So, be sure to enjoy a complimentary refreshment along the route. Golf carts, driven by our volunteers are available during the Tour. The Raffle will include events, items and services provided by local businesses. We have aimed for the stars this year with many wonderful surprises to be announced.

The Wellesley Hotel Restaurant is offering a lunchcon for pre-paid ticket holders. Seating is limited, so be sure to reserve your preferred time early in the season. The delicious lunch in a beautiful setting is a highlight of the Tour.
